Our visit to Yakult India Pvt. Ltd. Sonapat was scheduled on 17 March, 2021. The whole experience was quite good. The students were welcomed by Mr. Aadish PR Manager.

Mr. Aadish gave a presentation on the Yakult product and its nutrients. He discussed its benefits with us. He also told the students about different countries where Yakult is being sold. Thereafter they were given a brief presentation on the establishment of Yakult and its marketing strategies. They were informed that Yakult Danone India is a joint venture between Japanese & French industry. The capacity of the plant is 10 lakhs bottles (units) per day and the milk produced is of excellent quality containing billions of useful bacteria which are essential for proper functioning of digestive system.

Further, he told the students about home delivery of Yakult where female salesperson are being hired to deliver the product at doorstep. These delivery personnel are also making homemakers aware about probiotic products. There was an interactive question and answer session.

During the virtual tour students were taken for the visit inside the Processing Unit where different stages of processing namely mixing of raw ingredients, sterilization, fermentation, blending, injection moulding, scrambling, filling/sealing, shrinking and packaging, storage and their automatic control process were demonstrated. The product is produced very hygienically.

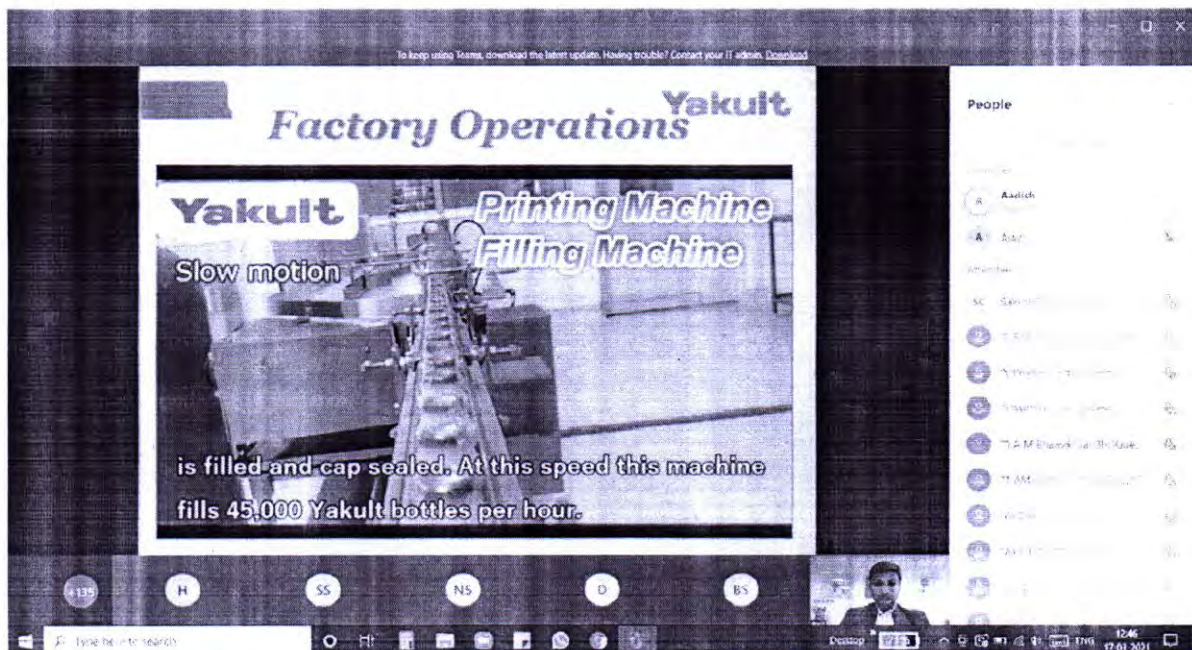

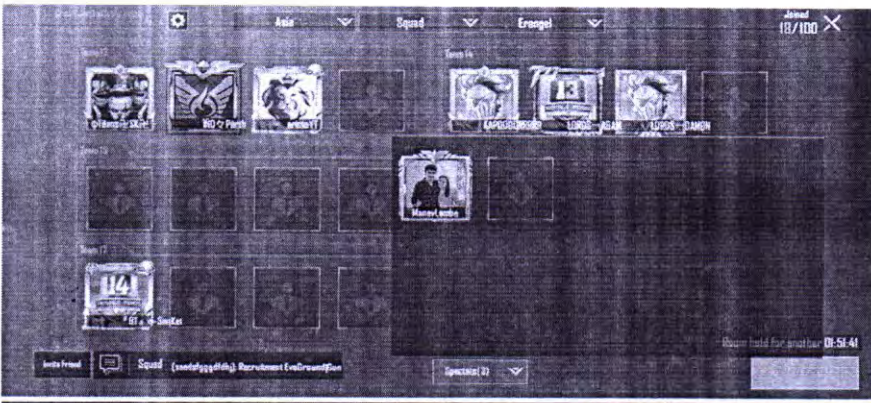
Report:

Major Mohanty, a retired man from the army, joined as MD in Sunrise Limited, when the company was passing through a very bad period with declining production and productivity, heavy losses and low morale of the employees. Major Mohanty, after having made in-depth, logical and strategic studies of the situation, immediately flagged on what he called 'operation rejuvenation, with exclusive thrust on production and productivity related issues. People related matters were of no consequence for him, for he believed that people, by and large, are dull, lazy, shirkers and non-starters and as such work should be extracted from them only through constant watch, close supervision, complete and rigorous command and control. His style of functioning did yield some results, but before any impact could be seen, he abruptly left the organisation, having got a better assignment in the United States of America. Major Mohanty was immediately succeeded by Mr. Soni, a man who had made a name for his balanced approach to people and production through participative style of management in his immediate position as the Deputy MD of a large organisation in a similar product line. He was, in fact, commended for his maximum concern for both people and production, and for bringing about an ideal integration and harmony between the needs of the employees and those of production. In the present company also, Mr. Soni continued his policies of participative management with equal concern for both production and people. With a view to reviving the company back to health, he instituted some major changes. First of all, he decentralized the organization so that the subordinates could exercise their discretion and

functions. Further he empowered the junior managers to incur expenditure up to an approved limit without seeking prior approval of the higher management. The communication system was also improved to facilitate free flow of upward and downward communication. Mr. Soni also adopted several measures to reduce costs and wasteful expenditure. He banned donations to charitable institutions, but increased the amount being spent on the welfare activities of the employees. Will Mr. Soni's managerial style prove to be effective in ensuring a bright future of the company? Some employees are of the view that a lot of things are being done, but they might not be effective in the long run. Others disagree with them, and say, 'Okay, we will give it a trial'.

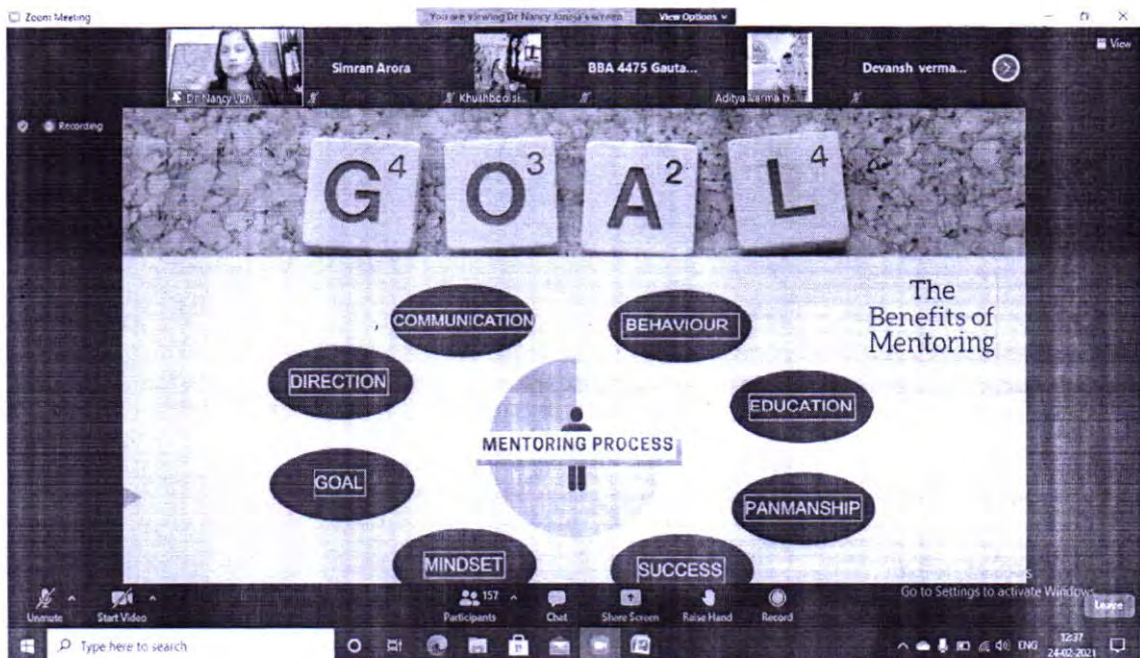
it. She talked about the mindset shift which converts every problem into an opportunity irrespective of resources available to them.

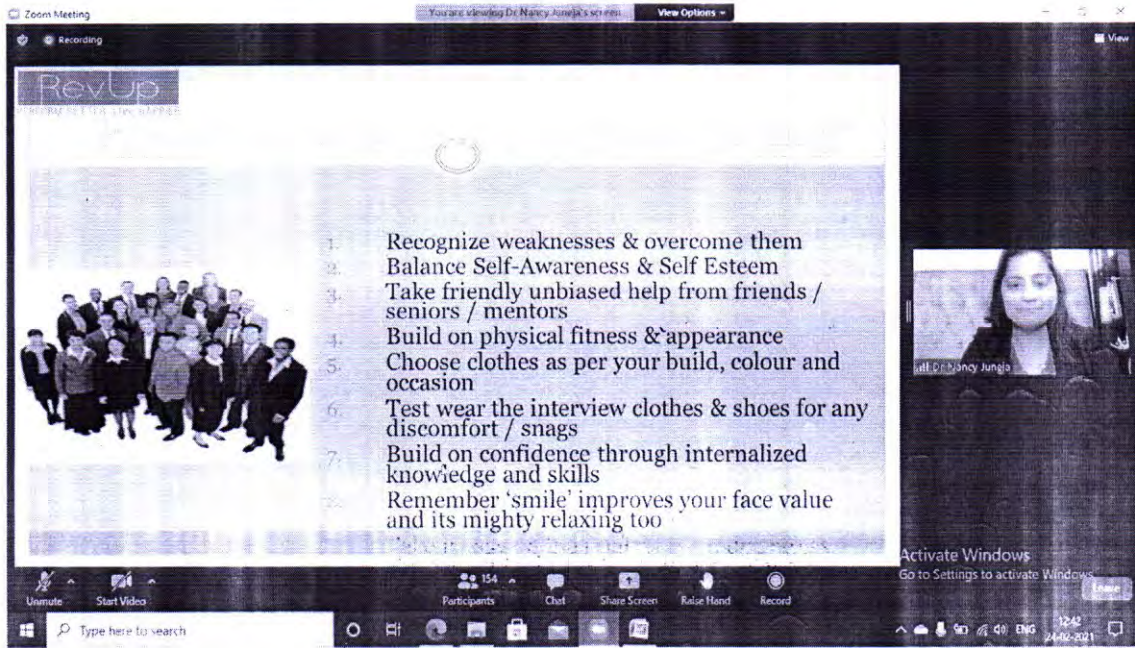

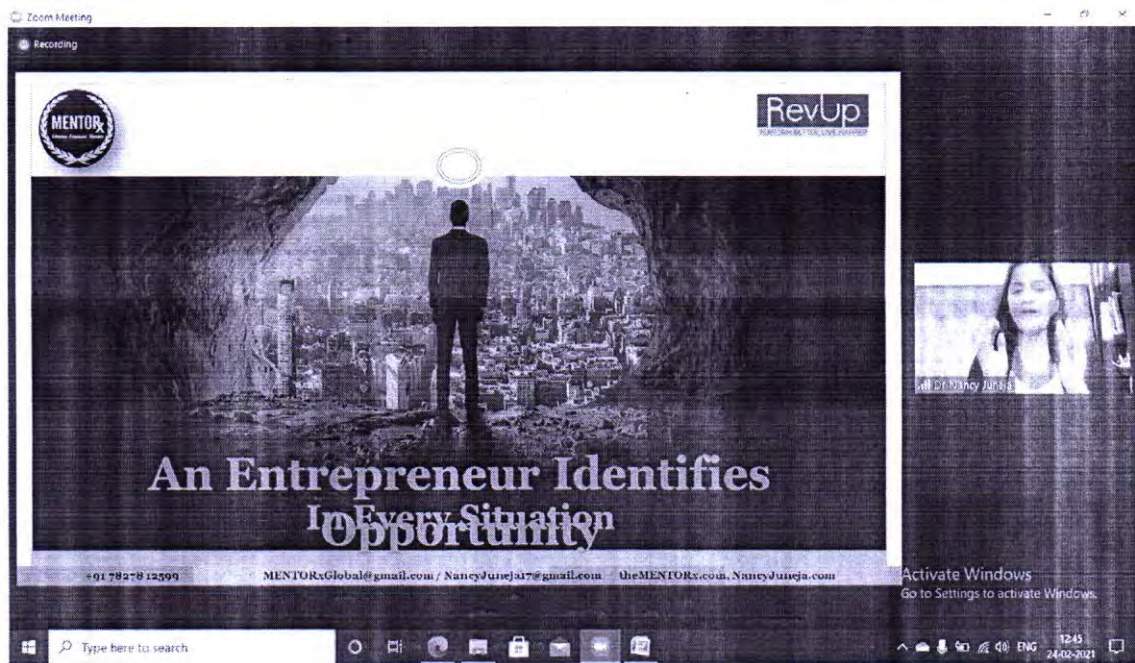

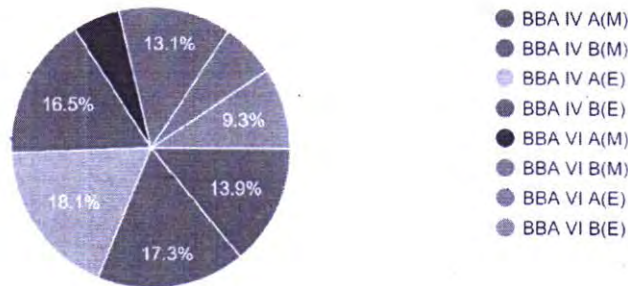

McDonald's reshaped the country's fast food culture by serving low-priced, value-oriented products, quickly and efficiently. According to industry observers, a key reason for its success was the ability to customise its menu to suit local tastes by understanding Indian customers' preferences. 


